

Treatment Team Sticky Notes

Purpose

"Treatment Team Sticky Notes" are a "Comment" type clinical communication available to non-prescriber inpatient clinicians to share operational commentary that is not part of the health record. There are many possible uses. Each ward or service should agree to a "pact" that includes clear direction about appropriate use. These notes may emulate some patient "Cardex" functions from paper workflows.

Use Cases

- ✓ Inpatient team continually edits and updates the "Treatment Team Sticky Notes" to signal conditions affecting patient journey or discharge readiness.
- Urgent communications about changes in patient status, orders needed or new interventions suggested should be communicated by phone, pager, or secure chat according to the communication pact agreed to by a particular clinical team.

 The Treatment Team Sticky Notes section of the inpatient Summary Activity (Overview) allows SmartText editing of the current note.
