

Connect Care Key Messages

Connect Care Physician Training

The Connect Care clinical information system (CIS) training program helps physicians attain safe competency and improving proficiency. The following messages related to physicians, physician trainees and other prescribers.

Physician-aware Prescribers train prescribers whenever possible, promoting clinician-sensitive

treatment of CIS concepts and skills.

Alberta-aware Training materials derived from Epic sources are adapted by Connect Care

physician trainers to fit Alberta and physician circumstances.

Work-aware Curricula are organized to address "Day in the Life" workflows in common clinical

areas.

Personalized Training is organized into "tracks" that fit typical clinical roles (e.g., Surgery,

Inpatient, Emergency, etc.). Common needs are addressed with standardized modules. Most physicians are assigned a single track befitting their primary

practice type. Medical learners have tracks that reflect their needs.

Staged Basic training covers essential knowledge and skills. Personalization training

helps users to shape the CIS to their preferences. Optimization training improves

proficiency once physicians discover ongoing needs.

Efficient Basic training imparts essential knowledge and skills in as short a time as

possible. Personalization and optimization times vary with user need.

Flexible Group (in-person), self-directed and case-based instruction are designed for

flexible access, diverse schedules, and different learning styles.

Experiential Case-based exercises allow physicians to practice learnings in ways that

anticipate actual clinical workflows.

Competency-

based

Completion of privacy awareness training, and attainment of a minimum score on a basic skills assessment, are required before physicians gain access to the full

(production) CIS.

CME-eligible AHS is approved for continuing medical education (CME) credits through both the

College of Family Physicians of Canada (pending) and the Royal College and

College of Family Physicians of Canada.

Regulationcompliant Connect Care training satisfies certification (CFPC, RCPSC), professional

standard (CPSA) as well as AHS staff bylaw requirements for physicians to attain

and use digital health record competencies.

Direct-expense-

free

High-quality, CME-eligible, training is provided with flexible times and locations, at no cost to users. As with other Alberta medical record initiatives, compensation for

indirect expenses (e.g., loss of clinic time) is not provided.

Strategic investment

Connect Care training helps build informatics capacity in physician communities. Physicians serving as provincial and clinical area trainers continually improve training methods and opportunities for physicians as Connect Care grows and

optimizes.
