

Connect Care Principles

Care Paths

Care paths are an advanced form of clinical decision support available in the Connect Care clinical information system. They guide goal-based management of health conditions across place and time by exposing key information, personalizing recommendations and promoting evidence-informed care.

1. Decision-Supports

Care Paths are informational supports designed to help clinical decision-makers align care with best possible practice informed by best available evidence.

2. Complexity-Managed

Care Paths are optimized to ease management of complex health conditions by multidisciplinary teams across the continuum of care.

3. Evidence-Informed

Care Paths reflect provincially endorsed clinical practice guidelines and expertise so that recommendations balance consideration of evidence, values and circumstances.

4. Collaborative

Care Paths support transparent multidisciplinary care with shared visualization of patients' health care goals and plans across settings, specialties and professions.

5. Transition-Enabling

Care Paths enhance clinical workflows with simple and intuitive supports for seamless transitions between levels and settings of care.

6. Comprehensive

Care Paths consolidate as much health care as possible into a single, standardized, provincially endorsed, 'base' path, with branches for unique local circumstances.

7. Flexible

Care Paths provide options, when appropriate, for removal from or resolution of a path; with exceptions explained and documented.

8. Monitored

Care Path performance is continually monitored by for process and outcome improvement, patient safety, cost-effectiveness and stakeholder satisfaction.

9. Maintained

Care Path quality is maintained through ongoing evidence surveillance, change management, dependency awareness, and mandated review dates.

10. Accountable

Care Path evidence, design and providence is exposed for just-in-time review, together with record of Connect Care CDS-Advanced Decision Support Subcommittee decisions and any escalated dispute resolutions.
